



> Welcome to Cambridge

Cambridge Programmes was established in 2004 and celebrated its 15th Anniversary in 2019 with over 200 participants joining us from around the world.

Now that the Covid pandemic is behind us, we are delighted to welcome our students back to Cambridge again.

We all know an excellent education can change lives and is the best investment parents can ever give to their children. We pride ourselves on our continued success in offering this unique opportunity to students through a rigorous academic and engaging two-week Programme. This is achieved firstly by inviting students to stay in one of the 31 Colleges of the prestigious University of Cambridge.

Secondly, our experienced senior teaching staff from both the University and the best academic schools in Cambridge will conduct classes. Lessons are in small groups, around 18 per class. Our syllabi are designed to interest students and provoke their intellectual curiosity, rather than repeating their schoolwork. Our key in teaching is to emphasise "how" to learn and "how" to think, rather than "what" to learn.

Thirdly, we believe a strong role model for teenagers is vital, especially in today's competitive and fast-changing world. We select, through a rigorous process, a group of Cambridge students acting as our participants' Mentors. A Mentor looks after approximately six students. Aside from the morning lessons, our Mentors further tutor the students in the afternoons and lead exciting activities in the evenings.



Fourthly, teamwork is so important in the workplace today whichever walk of life one chooses. Our Mentors work closely with their students to design a team project which is acted out on stage at the end of the Programme.

Last, but not least, our Summer Programme is great fun for students too and we include several exciting cultural visits outside Cambridge.

Whichever Programme our students join, we are confident that this will be a life-changing experience, just as it has been for the many thousands of students who have been privileged to be part of Cambridge Programmes so far!

> Churchill College

Churchill College is one of the 31 Colleges which make up Cambridge University.

The College was founded in 1960 in honour of the British Prime Minister and wartime leader, Sir Winston Churchill.

Its founders were far-sighted in recognising that the world was changing very rapidly under the influence of science and technology. Consequently 70% of the students are studying Science, Engineering or Mathematics.

There are 485 undergraduates and 390 post-graduates, supported by 245 Fellows. The College has produced 32 Nobel Prize winners including Francis Crick who discovered DNA and Anthony Hewish who discovered Pulsars.

Cambridge Programmes students are warmly welcomed by this academic community. The superb learning facilities are complemented by spacious playing fields used for both sport and, for example, staging a Shakespeare Drama Workshop next to a magnificent "Barbara Hepworth" sculpture.

Our students are extremely privileged to be able to reside over the two weeks in Churchill College, staying in their student rooms, normally occupied by undergraduates during Term time.

This is a quiet academic environment as other Senior College Academics are also working in College during this period.

All these rooms are single, some with en-suite facilities and provide comfortable living accommodation. Boys and girls are on separate staircases with secured entry.

Meals are prepared in the College Kitchen and students eat in the Dining Hall where members of the College normally take their meals.

There is on-site security 24/7 during our stay at Churchill.





Academic English (ages 14-17)

The English course at Cambridge Programmes aims to offer a world-class academic experience to ambitious students who are keen to develop their skills in all aspects of this key area of the curriculum. The course combines both literary study and aspects of advanced writing skills. At all times English is approached as a world language which is essential for success in a globalised world. Literacy is also considered in the context of transferable skills which can be employed across the curriculum.

The Academic English Programme offers an intense and challenging pathway to advanced all-round language capability.





History (ages 14-17)

This course is tailor-made for students who are interested in social sciences, liberal arts, and English at university; or who simply wish to learn more about the great events, ideas, and people that have shaped our world.

Students enrolled in this course will have the opportunity to study a range of historical subjects in university-style lectures and supervisions, and will engage with Cambridge's treasure-trove of museums, art and architecture. Students will gain analytical skills directly applicable to their study of History, English and other secondary school subjects, and have a unique opportunity to broaden their horizons and achieve a deeper appreciation of the past and its impact on the present.





Engineering the Future/AI (ages 15-17)

This programme is designed to provide students with a strong understanding of Engineering and to give them insights into its applications in the real world. The programme broadly targets three domains: theory, applications, and engineering in industry.

Students will learn about Software and AI through introductory lectures and will work towards a coding project, as well as gaining hands-on experience with the Engineering Design Process by designing and building a solution for a practical challenge. Sustainability in design is an important emphasis of the project.

Students will also develop the key presentation skills essential to science and engineering in the real world.

Law Induction (ages 15-17)

The Law Induction Programme offers students an opportunity to experience the excitement of a legal career. The Programme provides an overview of the legal system in England and Wales, and an introduction to aspects of Criminal Law, Tort Law, Constitutional Law, Criminology, and Jurisprudence.

Cambridge University-style teaching and supervisions are complemented by visits to courts of local and national significance, and there are also opportunities to develop practical skills through mooting (mock-trials) and debating. Students are also given guidance on applying to study Law at university, and on careers after a Law degree.

Medicine (ages 16+)

The aim of the Medicine Programme is to give participants a unique and realistic experience of what it is like to study medicine and to be a doctor. In addition to practical and interactive sessions on the main medical sciences and specialities, the course also covers other key topics and areas that are relevant to healthcare, including emerging technologies and future developments, ethical and legal issues, team working and communication, presentation and interview skills. This unique and intensive Programme includes a wide range of activities and topics, many of which are not available on any other course worldwide.

The course is designed by Professor Kourosh Saeb-Parsy, Consultant Transplant Surgeon and Research Group Leader of the University of Cambridge, and Fellow and Director of Studies in Clinical Medicine at Fitzwilliam College, Cambridge. The course is delivered by Professor Saeb-Parsy and other expert, young and enthusiastic faculty members who are very experienced in teaching methods and are highly active in the areas that they teach on the course

Chris GreenDeputy Director and Director of Studies for English

Chris is Director of the English and Drama Faculty at The Perse School in Cambridge, and he is also Principal Examiner for A Level English Literature with a UK Awarding Body. Chris is a former Chair of the Education committee of the British Shakespeare Association and is a member of the Assessment Board of the Chartered College of Teaching. He is a Fellow of the Chartered Institute of Educational Assessors and a member of committees at the English Association and the National Association for the Teaching of Drama. Chris works with the English-Speaking Union as a Judge and Mentor, and he has been involved in activities with the Royal Shakespeare Company, and at the Royal National and Young Vic theatres. He has taught outreach sessions for Lucy Cavendish College, Cambridge – and he has mentored students in south London for the charities Off the Curriculum and Southside Young Leaders Academy. His latest publication is a new edition of Shakespeare's The Merchant of Venice.



Dr Tom TysonDirector of Studies for History

After obtaining a First in History, Tom continued his studies at Cambridge University and obtained two further degrees, an MPhil and a PhD. He is also a Doctoral Fellow at the Institute of Historical Research, London. Tom is totally passionate about teaching, having taught History and Politics A Level for several years. He has won a number of academic awards, including the Dr Lightfoot Prize for Ecclesiastical History. The syllabus Tom designed for us is attractive to both young and old learners. Learning History will empower us to be more analytical which is crucially important in today's complex world.

Aalok Patwardhan
Director of Studies for

Having graduated from Cambridge University with a First in Engineering, Aalok embarked on an engineering consultancy position at the famous Cambridge Consultants based in the Science Park in Cambridge.

Rob Marsh *Director of Studies for Law Induction*

Rob Marsh is a PhD researcher at the Faculty of Law, University of Cambridge, where his research is funded by a prestigious Arts and Humanities Research Council studentship. Rob is also currently a Managing Editor at the Cambridge International Law Journal.

Rob has a First Class undergraduate degree in Law (Jurisprudence) from the University of Oxford – where he was awarded college prizes for his results – and a Master's in Law Degree, with Distinction, from University College London where he was a Dean's Scholar.



Professor Kourosh Saeb-Parsy Director of Studies for Medicine

Kourosh is a Professor at the Department of Surgery, University of Cambridge and a Consultant Transplant Surgeon at Cambridge University's teaching hospital (Addenbrooke's). His clinical interests include adult kidney, pancreas and liver transplantation. He leads a research group focused on the function and immune response to stem cells. Kourosh is a Fellow and Director of Studies in Clinical Medicine at Fitzwilliam College.







Round the Clock Pastoral Care

Your child will be looked after and cared for 24/7 from the minute they arrive in the UK.

The safety and care of your child is our number one concern. Our pastoral care policy comes in several levels.

The Directors, Rebecca and Peter Clarke, assume overall responsibility. (Peter has experience as the former Bursar of a girls' school responsible for health and safety of 500 girls).

The Programme Dean, a former school Vice-Principal, works closely with the Mentors each of whom looks after 6 or 7 students. This allows Mentors to get to know their students very quickly and very well. All six students study the same subject, in the same academic class.

As well as nurturing intellectual curiosity, critical thinking and self-confidence, our Mentors protect and support their students at all times, through academic, physical and emotional needs. The Mentors are supported by our very experienced Dean and Matron, both of whom also live on site and provide professional guidance.

Mentors receive training in Health and Safety, and Children Safeguarding, before the start of each Programme.

The Programme Matron is a highly experienced and qualified School Matron used to looking after the medical needs of 600 girls and boys.

There is a Doctor's Surgery very close to Churchill College and moreover, Cambridge is the venue for the famous research and teaching hospital at Addenbrooke's.


